THE YACHT

Built by Arcadia Yachts, 35 metre Sun, first named M'Ocean, was the first of her series and turned heads from the beginning. However, her conception runs deeper than just an original look. Consistent with the designer's vision, the challenge was to create an ecofriendly yacht without compromising on style, volume or comfort.

The result is a beautifully modern and sleek superyacht, complete with double glazing and solar panels, smaller engines and a fibreglass semi-planing hull to optimise fuel consumption and speed. Sun also boasts large interior spaces and over 140 square metres of deck space making her an ideal choice for those who love outdoor living and entertainment.

CAPTAIN HAKAN DIKER

Sun is most at home cruising the Med and Aegean coastlines, and throughout his many years of experience, Captain Hakan Diker has tallied up some favourite anchorages along the Greek and Turkish coasts. Hakan has been working on VIP charters for nearly 21 years, and it comes as no surprise that he is confident in his ability to deliver a great experience for guests. He is very proud of the boat, as are the crew, and this pride shines in every aspect of their service.



THE EXPERIENCE

As you walk from the aft deck into the main salon, designer Francesco Guida's vision comes alive. Thanks to the eight metre beam, the main salon is vast with panoramic views on all sides.

40 square metres of solar panels on the ceiling create striking shadows and light, and the insulation means there is virtually no noise. In addition, this stored energy means reduced generator time and therefore even more savings and even less noise.

When underway, all appliances are generally able to run on stored energy, which is not only a luxury but added peace of mind.

Sun has six stylish staterooms accommodating up to 12 guests. There are three double cabins and two twins (both of which are convertible to doubles) in addition to the master suite, which is nearly double the size of those found on more traditional yachts.

Guida's design also provides for crew quarters nearly twice as large as typically expected, allowing the six crew to live in harmony, just like their guests.

A deck space of over 140 square metres provides a whole new element to outdoor living and entertainment, and families appreciate the additional safety elements for children as the walkways are less narrow while the decks provide a great space for little ones to play on.



Windows disappear and convertible terraces create even more volume, creating an all-round impression of fluidity throughout. The salon even has extendable wing balconies on both side decks providing yet another way to feel at one with the sea.

The owner, he tells us, thinks of the yacht as his home, so therefore takes no shortcuts in ensuring that his guests are well taken care of. While Sun is extremely modern, as set out by Arcadia, comfort is king.
